#### Section 4: First Aid Measures

Necessary first aid measures	<b>ACCIDENTAL SELF-INJECTION</b> Obtain medical attention - show this SDS. Accidental self injection may lead to an inflammatory response and medical advice should be sought on the management of deep injections, particularly those near a joint or associated with bruising. If possible the application of gentle squeezing pressure with absorbent material (e.g. facial tissues) at the injection site will swab up unabsorbed vaccine. Strong squeezing of the site should be avoided. The damaged area should be thoroughly cleansed and a topical antiseptic applied.
	<b>SKIN CONTACT</b> While wearing protective gloves, carefully remove any contaminated clothing, including shoes, and wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. If irritation or symptoms occur or persist, consult a doctor.
	<b>EYE CONTACT</b> Immediately rinse eyes thoroughly with plenty of water. If wearing contact lenses, remove only after initial rinse, and continue rinsing eyes for at least 15 minutes. If irritation occurs or persists, consult a doctor.
	<b>INGESTION</b> Rinse mouth and drink a glass of water. Do not induce vomiting unless under the direction of a qualified medical professional or Poison Control Centre. If symptoms persist, consult a doctor.
	<b>INHALATION</b> Remove to fresh air. If any trouble breathing, get immediate medical attention. Administer artificial respiration if breathing has ceased. If irritation or symptoms occur or persist, consult a doctor.

Notes for medical personnel	<b>Accidental self-injection:</b> Treat symptomatically. Some risk of hypersensitivity from injection. Contains safety tested inactivated bacterial toxins. Contamination of the needle must be considered.

#### Chronic/long term effects for individual ingredients only

Levamisole: Levamisole induced chromosome gaps and breaks in human lymphocytes in vitro and in vivo after volunteers were given 2 mg/kg. No chromosomal damage occurred in mice given 2.5 mg/kg subcutaneously. Levamisole; ADI of 0-6 µg/kg based on LOAEL of 1.25 mg/kg/day haemolytic effects in dogs, safety factor of 200. MRLs of 100 µg/kg in muscle, kidney and fat, and 100 µg/kg for liver.

Thiomersal has been documented as a sensitiser. [All references from NTP]
